Awards, Fellowships, & Achievements

- June 2016 **The Governor General’s Silver Medal**
Awarded to the three undergraduate students who achieve the highest academic standing overall upon graduation at the University of Alberta.
- June 2016 **Chancellor’s Leadership Medal**
\$500 and a silver medal awarded to a convocating undergraduate student at the University of Alberta that has demonstrated outstanding leadership involvement throughout an undergraduate degree, while maintaining superior academic achievement in a final year of study.
- June 2016 **Dr. John MacDonald Medal in Arts**
\$1300 and sterling gilt medal awarded to a convocating student with superior academic achievement in the BA Honors program in the Faculty of Arts, University of Alberta. Recipient will be the student who has shown the highest distinction in scholarship.
- May 2016 **SSHRC Doctoral Fellowship (Declined)**
\$80,000 over 48 months awarded for study of a PhD in Ethnic Studies at the University of California, Berkeley. *Declined to take up a Rhodes Scholarship at the University of Oxford.*
- March 2016 **University of California, Berkeley Multi-Year Fellowship, Department of Ethnic Studies (Declined)**
\$68,000 over 24 months and teaching appointments in years three and four. *Declined to take up a Rhodes Scholarship at the University of Oxford.*
- Nov. 2015 **Rhodes Scholarship**
Considered the most academically prestigious scholarship in the world, the Rhodes Scholarship is awarded to “exceptional students from around the world to study at the University of Oxford.” Covers all University and College fees, a personal stipend (£13,658 per annum) and one economy class airfare to Oxford, as well as an economy flight back to the student’s home country.
- August 2015 **Peter Lougheed Leadership Scholarship**
\$10,000 awarded to students with superior academic achievement registered in either of the final two years of an undergraduate degree at the University of Alberta. Recipients selected on the basis of demonstrated leadership in university of community organizations, sports activities, or cultural activities.
- 2014 & 2015 **Louis McKinney Scholarship**

\$2500 awarded on the basis of superior academic achievement (top 1.5-2% of faculty) to students at the University of Alberta who are also Alberta residents.

- 2014 & 2015 **Dean's List, Faculty of Arts, University of Alberta**
 Awarded to students in the Faculty of Arts whose average on a minimum of 30 units of course weight during the preceding Fall and Winter term is 3.5 or better.
- 2015 **Dr. Geneva Misener Memorial Scholarship in Modern Languages**
 \$1,000 Awarded to a student with superior academic achievement completing the third year of an honour's program with a principle subject area in the Department of Modern Languages and Cultural Studies.

 \$5000 to cultivate and support research partnerships between undergraduate students and faculty members, providing for 15 weeks of research-based activity over the summer.

 \$4500 tenured by Dr. Chloë Taylor to support an undergraduate research assistant to assist with a SSHRC-funded project.
- 2014 **Michael Phair Leadership Award**
 \$1000 awarded to students with satisfactory academic standing entering the second, third, or fourth year of studies. Selection based on demonstrated leadership qualities and involvement in extracurricular and community activities. Preference given to students who have demonstrated commitment to the advancement of lesbian, gay, bisexual, trans, two-spirit, or queer communities.

 \$1000 in recognition of the highest overall academic standing in the preceding Winter term at the University of Alberta. Can only be awarded to an applicant once.

 \$4500 awarded over three years to a student with satisfactory academic standing of at least 3.3 GPA studying Humanities and/or Social Sciences.
- 2013 **Jason Lang Scholarship**

\$1000 designed to reward the outstanding academic achievement of Alberta post-secondary students who are continuing into their second, third, or fourth year of studies. Cannot be awarded to a student who wins the Louis McKinney Scholarship.

2012 **University of Alberta Academic Excellence Scholarship**
 \$2000 awarded to students with superior academic achievement entering the first year of an undergraduate degree at the University of Alberta.

2012 **Alexander Rutherford Academic Excellence Scholarship**
 \$2500 rewards exceptional academic achievement at the senior high level and encourages students to pursue post-secondary studies.
